

Visa Information

For US Citizens

Fiancé(e) Visa (K-1): If you are a US citizen planning to marry a Mexican national, you can apply for a K-1 visa for your fiancé(e). The K-1 visa permits your fiancé(e) to enter the US for the purpose of getting married within 90 days of arrival. After marriage, your spouse can apply for an adjustment of status to obtain a Green Card.

Spouse Visa (CR-1 or IR-1): If you are already married to a Mexican citizen, you can apply for a CR-1 or IR-1 visa for your spouse. The CR-1 visa is for marriages that are less than two years old, while the IR-1 visa is for marriages older than two years. Both visas allow your spouse to live and work in the US and eventually apply for US citizenship.
