

United States

The process of receiving a visa to the USA can be very daunting.

Certain steps are imperative. Consider the following:

- The first step is to file for a K-1 Fiancé(e) Visa. You can fill in the form online and submit it.
- After this, you will be requested to provide proof of eligibility that your bride qualifies for this particular visa type.
- The next step is to file an I-129F petition and cover the MRV fees. These amount to \$265.00 USD.
- Wait for approval that will be sent to your email address. That is if you submit the form online.
- The last step is to pass the visa interview at the United States Consulate.

Australia

The process of visa application to Australia is less complex.

However, there are also certain steps that you must consider:

- The first step is to file for Spouse Visas (Subclass 820/801 & 309/100) or Fiance or Prospective Marriage Visa (Subclass 300).
- Although not always, candidates are sometimes requested to provide proof of eligibility that the bride qualifies.
- Wait for approval from the Consulate after all your documents are reviewed.



The United Kingdom

This is the most daunting process of visa application. However, follow the advice below to simplify it for yourself:

- Your bride will first apply for a spouse or fiancé visa.
- A must is to provide proof of eligibility that your bride or wife (you are getting married in Iceland) can participate in this program and apply for this particular visa.
- The UK authorities will require a valid marriage certificate to prove that you are indeed married and that she is eligible for a UK visa.
- You will also be required to provide evidence of a genuine relationship. Photographs of you and her together, and possibly proof of living together, should be sufficient. However, you will be told exactly what they want to see.
- Proof of accommodation in the UK must be provided. Since you are the inviting party, you should have a place to invite them.
- Your wife/spouse/bride must pass an English language test. This is mandatory and cannot be avoided.
- After all the documents have been checked, you will receive a response from the British authorities regarding their decision.
